### **Parking Information**

There are several varieties of on-street parking near the hotel. Some meters run until 6pm, others until 8pm. Summer Street is posted for street cleaning *every* night starting at midnight. Check carefully what the rules are for your chosen spot if you park on-street.

### **Saturday Evening Shuttle**

Boskone will run a 29-passenger shuttle Saturday evening about every 30 minutes from 5pm to 10pm, stopping at the hotel main entrance, South Station (only outbound from the hotel), and Quincy Market (near the North End). When returning to the hotel, get on where you got off. Show your badge when boarding.

There is a hotel shuttle which runs to Faneuil Hall on demand every 30 minutes from 5-7:30pm weekdays and 4-7:30pm weekends. Conditions permitting, it will drop people off enroute. Call the hotel to ensure pickup at Faneuil Hall.
